Jing Wang, PhD, MPH, RN, FAAN, an interdisciplinary trained researcher, educator, and policy and executive leader in nursing and higher education, is dean of the College of Nursing at Florida State University. She is a nationally recognized leader on health equity and digital health, which uses computing platforms, connected devices, software, and sensors for healthcare and related uses.

Wang is a Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing, President of the Asian American/Pacific Islander Nurses Association, and board of directors at National Coalition of Ethnic Minority Nurses Association. She is also in the National Institute of Nursing Research Council Working Group on Diversity, AARP/RWJF Future of Nursing Campaign for Action's Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion Steering Committee, and a National Academy of Medicine Emerging Leader in Health and Medicine. She currently serves as the Board of Trustee at HCA Florida Capitol Hospital, and Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, the largest foundation in the U.S. solely dedicated to health.

As Dean and previously Vice Dean for Research, she established and founded several research centers that significantly increased extramural research funding, developed pipeline programs to promote faculty and student diversity from first-generation and underrepresented minority communities, increased undergraduate and graduate enrollment and U.S. News ranking of the college.
